

Sustainable performance: "The hero's Journey"

Always wondering what distinguishes very successful entrepreneurs from others? A lot has to do with having the right mentality and attitude. In this workshop we will help you to create a continuous work and creativity Flow which will allow you to create a sustainable performance.

Artists and society	<p>This module consists of at least one session with the trainer/course leader to introduce the concept of the Journey, and at least one follow-up to see where the Journey session took them in the first place. Questions and assignments serve as a go-between. When possible, a ritual at the end of the course serves as a way to settle the intention of the participants for their future. Ideally, the first introductory session takes place near the start of the Academy, an in-between session halfway through, and the intention ritual is set at the end. For the first Academy, Frank Heckman created a Native American fire ritual (open for all religions and denominations of course) that had great impact on the participants.</p>	For the first session a spacious room without furniture is required. For the ritual at the end, there is no fixed requirement: the group may participate in an existing ritual (e.g. the fire ritual that Frank Heckman used in the first Academy in the Netherlands) or make one for themselves., A facilitator is needed to guide the discussion and prompt participants to name how they fill in their own Hero's Journey.
